

LETTER OF PAUL VI TO BROTHER PAUL LEONARD HAGARTY, BISHOP OF NASSAU

Wednesday, 6 June 1973

To Our Venerable Brother Paul Leonard Hagarty Bishop of Nassau

On the occasion of the Solemn Mass in observance of the forthcoming declaration of the Independence of the Bahamas as a State within the Commonwealth of Nations, we have pleasure in extending our cordial greetings and in associating ourself with the joy of the celebration.

At the same time we would ask you to convey our felicitation and good wishes to the Governor-General, Prime Minister, Government and People of the Bahamas at the beginning of this new epoch in the history of the Islands. We avail ourself of the occasion to assure them that the Church will not cease to be ready to offer whatever assistance is within her power for the furtherance of the spiritual, moral and temporal well-being and prosperity of the Nation.
